MAK YOUR AIN SCOTS STREET NAME

In Scots, a **Gate** is a street and a **Brae** is a hill.

Step 1

To get you started, watch the **Bonnie Gate**, **Baffie Brae** and **Fitbaw Gate** animations at:

Step 2

Add a Scots word to **Gate** or **Brae** to make up a new name like **Braw Gate** or **Bogle Brae**.

You can choose from:

Muckle (big)

Lang

Auld

Bairn

Dug

Moose

Cuddie (horse)

Floer

Tattie

Aipple

Mercat (market)

Grumphie (pig),

or choose a Scots word of your own.

Step 3

Draw a picture of your Scots street. Think about the meaning of the Scots word you've chosen for your street name.

For example, if you've chosen to draw the **Dug Gate**, your street could have lots of different kinds of dugs (dogs). You could have kennels instead of hooses.

Or if you want to draw **Bogle Brae**, there could be lots of haunted hoose and ghosties on the brae.
